Dunstable is an evolving town with ongoing improvements, one being air quality, with reduced nitrous oxide levels since the lorry restriction through the town centre on the opening of the new M1 -A5 link road and Woodside connections. Now only goods vehicles delivering to the local area can pass through. We are also a growing town with a population coming up to 40,000, with a diversity of cultures and nationalities, which will enhance the town going forward.

In my mayoral year I will be holding several events for my chosen charities, which are the Alzheimer's Society, Autism Bedfordshire, Signposts and Minds2gether. I will be asking for your help in raising funds throughout the year to these deserving causes. 

Have you ventured out with your children to the new Bennett's Adventure Play at Bennett Memorial Recreation Ground yet?

The Town Mayor of Dunstable, Councillor Sid Abbott, formally opened the play area with support from Councillor Ian Dalgarno of Central Bedfordshire Council, at a ribbon cutting ceremony on Thursday 30 May 2019.

The event took place during the May half-term week and plenty of children, parents and grandparents were on hand to enjoy DJ Big Man Craig's disco and games as well as playing on the new equipment.

The new play area, which is made from very tough Robinia wood, is suitable for 2 to 15 year olds and has plenty of great play features. The features include a five platform multi unit with two slides, an adventure trail climbing jungle, a climbing boulder, two trampolines set in the ground, a rustic seesaw, a multi child swing, a low level climbing path, three low level bridge jungle climbing routes, 35 stepping posts set at various heights and a double zip wire aerial runway. How much fun does all that sound?

The play area was funded using £176,000 secured by Central Bedfordshire Council from housing developer contributions and Dunstable Town Council added a further £24,000 from its own funds.

Playground Supplies Ltd won the contract to design and build the play area in time for the reopening of Bennett's Splash and the Splashside Café and they were on hand at the grand opening to give out party bags to local children.

Dunstable Town Councillor Liz Jones, Chairman of the Grounds and Environmental Services Committee, said: "It is wonderful to have completed this great new play area to sit alongside Bennett's Splash and the Splashside Café. We hope that children and parents will both enjoy and take care of the new equipment and that the whole family will have a great day out at Bennett's."

Councillor Ian Dalgarno, Executive Member for Community Services at Central Bedfordshire Council, said: "We are delighted to have secured money from local new housing developments to enable the Town Council to create the new adventure play area. We know that the splash park, which was also part funded by our capital money and developer contributions, has been very popular. This latest addition will help encourage children to get out into the fresh air and take part in imaginative play experiences, be physically active and have fun. It will also draw-in both residents and visitors, to help ensure that Dunstable continues to be a place where people want to live, work and play."

If you are planning a visit to Bennett's Adventure Play and Bennett's Splash for a great day out please make use of the large car park at Ashton Square, just a two minute walk away. The car park can be accessed from Bull Pond Lane and West Street entrances. Parking costs are £1 for two hours or £2 for three hours Monday to Saturday from 8.00 am to 6.00 pm. Parking is free of charge outside of these hours and on Tuesday afternoon, as well as on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

Memorial Plaques at Dunstable Cemetery

Have you recently been bereaved and would like a focal point to remember a loved one or lay flowers, even if they are buried elsewhere? The memorial kerb plaque garden area at Dunstable Cemetery provides an opportunity to place a memorial plaque on a polished granite kerb around an attractive feature flowerbed. The area is easy to reach via gently sloping footpaths, which are ideal for visitors with mobility difficulties. The plaques can be placed for a period of either 25 or 35 years for a one-off payment.
