New Home for **Research Collection**

The research collection assembled by Dunstable and District Local History Society has now moved from Priory House to rooms in Dunstable Town Council's offices at Grove House

The council made the space available to the society when the previous research area at Priory House became needed when new facilities were created there for wedding ceremonies. The new research rooms contain a vast number of local history books and manuscripts, together with maps, newspaper cuttings and photographs.

The society, formed in 1991, has been steadily increasing the collection which is an invaluable source for historians. It has recently added the archives of the Dunstable Gazette, including many bound newspaper files, which had previously been stored at Luton. The Gazette's collection of photo negatives, dating back to the 1930s, remains at Luton Museum in Wardown Park, and microfilms of past copies of the paper can be viewed at Dunstable Library.

Dunstable History Society's research facilities are available to the general public but because Grove House is a working council office, prospective visitors need to make an appointment via a society member. The most effective way of doing this is through the contact form on the society's website, www.dunstablehistory.co.uk

The website also contains numerous articles, photos and copies of all the society's newsletters, plus details of speakers at the society's monthly meetings.

This 1950s photo, from the history society's archives, shows Grove House when it was next door to a Gothic-style mansion whose gatehouse, used as a doctor's surgery in later years, can be seen on the right. There was an ambulance station on the left, now the Grove Corner young people's centre.

Dunstable wins Best Large Town in the Anglia region and collects 4 Gold and 1 Silver Gilt Medal at the Anglia in Bloom Awards

This year marks the 10th anniversary of Dunstable in Bloom and what a way to celebrate with more awards this year than any other. The Deputy Town Mayor of Dunstable, Councillor Liz Jones and some of the town's In Bloom team attended the Anglia in Bloom Awards Ceremony in St. Ives, Cambridgeshire to collect the prestigious awards. The Town achieved the following accolades:

- Gold overall for the Town and winner of the Best Large Town in the region
- Gold for Priory Gardens
- Gold for Grove House Gardens and winner of the Best Small Park in the region
- Gold for Dunstable Cemetery and winner of the Best Large Cemetery in the region
- Silver Gilt for The Old Place Lodge Tudor Walled Garden
- Winner of the Best Floral Display by a community Priory View Roof Garden
- Hugh Garrod (Chairman of Dunstable in Bloom) nominated for the Mike Ames Award for his services to Dunstable in Bloom.

Commenting on the success, Councillor Liz Jones said: "I was delighted to attend the award ceremony in this special 10th year of Dunstable in Bloom. It was wonderful to see Dunstable collect so many awards and I am very proud of the fantastic community effort made across our town by all sections of our community. The achievements this year are a credit to the hard work of the In Bloom volunteers, all the community projects and the Town Council working together to help maintain and improve our town".

The Chairman of Dunstable in Bloom, Hugh Garrod, said: "I was delighted to receive a nomination for the Mike Ames Award in our 10th year, but the real credit goes to the many volunteers who have supported our campaign over the years. What a wonderful way to celebrate our 10th anniversary"

More Green Flags for Dunstable

Dunstable Cemetery, Priory Gardens and Grove House Gardens have again been recognised as among the UK's very best green spaces.

The three sites have been recognised by the Green Flag Award Scheme for the tenth year running, as among the very best open spaces in the country. They are among a record-breaking 1,970 UK parks and green spaces and 131 in thirteen other countries around the world, that have received the prestigious Green Flag Award as a mark of a quality park or green space.

The awards, now into a third decade nationally, are a sign to the public that the spaces boast the highest possible environmental standards, are beautifully maintained and have excellent visitor facilities.

The Town Mayor of Dunstable, Councillor Sid Abbott, raised the flag at a special ceremony on 12 September accompanied by fellow councillors, cemetery and grounds staff, the Friends of Dunstable Cemetery and partner organisations.

Dunstable Town Councillor Liz Jones, Chairman of the Grounds and Environmental Services Committee said: "We are absolutely delighted to have retained all three Green Flags in 2019 and to have improved our overall score and rating for Dunstable Cemetery. We know how much quality green spaces matter to residents and visitors, and these awards celebrate the work of the Town Council and local residents and the dedication that goes into maintaining them to such a high standard."

The parade of the town's ex-service and uniformed organisations will assemble in Grove House Gardens (at the rear of Grove House) at 10.15 am and will then march to the War Memorial in Priory Gardens, via High Street North to the crossroads and traffic lights, then down High Street South to Priory House where the Town Mayor will take the salute. The parade will then form up at the memorial for the Act of Remembrance and wreath-laying ceremony at 11.00 am. At the end of the ceremony everyone is invited to attend a short Service of Remembrance at Priory Church.

There will also be a short service at the War Memorial to mark Armistice Day on Monday 11 November at 11.00 am.

Members of the public are most welcome to take part in Dunstable's Act of Remembrance. Dunstable Town Council are once again keen to involve as many young people of the town as possible and would like to encourage representatives from schools in the town to take part in the parade and wreath laying.
