Welcome

...to this special edition of Talk of the Town, produced especially to update our residents on what the Town Council is, and has been doing, throughout the Covid-19 Pandemic and associated lockdown period.

At the time of writing this introduction, the Council has been in lockdown for ten weeks. During this time many of the Council's staff have been at work as normal. The grounds team and Dunstable Cemetery staff have been working hard to keep Dunstable's parks and open spaces looking beautiful and all Cemetery services have been maintained as normal. The Town Rangers have been out and about making sure the town centre and neighbourhoods are kept in good order. Staff have also been able to continue working from home and I am sure that many of you are now as familiar as we are with Microsoft Team's and Zoom meetings as shown below.

Your Town Councillors have been able to use Microsoft Teams to continue having 'virtual' Council meetings including meetings to comment on planning applications and holding its Annual Council Meeting that has ensured the Town Mayor is selected and important Council procedural matters are addressed.

Many of our staff have also been involved in supporting Central Bedfordshire Council and their voluntary sector partners in efforts to provide essential emergency services to vulnerable households in Dunstable. This has included collecting shopping, prescriptions, delivering food parcels and making over 200 phone calls per week to vulnerable households to make sure shielded and isolated residents are fully supported, having access to food and medical supplies and, of equal importance, having someone to talk to during this very difficult period.

The Council is now looking to re-start some of its service provision in line with Government guidance and whilst we have had to take the enormously difficult decision to cancel our summer events and activities programme, we are able to announce that some of our services will soon be available again. This includes our markets on Middle Row and the re-opening of Priory House. Further details are given later in this edition and please note that all services will be operated following the completion of full Covid-19 Secure Risk Assessments, details of which will be published on our website.

> Everyone at Dunstable Town Council hopes that our residents remain safe and well and we all look forward to life returning to some form of normality. We especially hope that the town centre can be revitalised over the next few weeks to ensure that Dunstable's economy bounces back as soon as possible.

Our award-winning gardens are being kept tidy and the town centre areas are being kept clean. Many staff have been taking on different duties to meet the situation in which we find ourselves. I do sincerely thank all our staff for their unstinting work at this

Council meetings are being held virtually. Since these are public meetings you can observe them on your lap-top or computer screen by contacting the Town Clerk and Chief Executive. It is a new way of working for most of us. We will be holding our next full Council in June using the Microsoft Teams platform. It is hoped that by the time we get to October we will be able once again to meet in the Council Chamber.

We need to be prepared for when we can return to more 'normal' circumstances. I look forward to bringing back an events programme, now sadly curtailed for the obvious reasons. I would like to engage with as many of the shops and businesses in the town as I can, recognising their contribution to Dunstable and encouraging managers and staff to take a greater part in our events.

There are a number of projects to improve the appearance of our town, starting in and around Ashton Square and High Street North. These will start as soon as circumstances allow.

In 2021 the Town will be competing in Britain in Bloom having been put forward as a result of our successes in Anglia in Bloom. It is an honour for the town to be part of this national competition. This is in fact a year's delay since there will be no judging for either competition this summer.

I know we are all looking forward to the town's shops and other businesses being fully open again. Let's support them to the full.

Since the end of March, when the lockdown was announced, the Town Council has been doing all it can to keep services running as normal as possible and to help in the local effort to support vulnerable households in Dunstable. This edition features some of the work that the Council has been engaged in.

We are now looking to the future and following the most recent Government announcement, we are planning to do all we can to re-introduce services on a phased basis in a way that keeps our staff and service users as safe as possible. During this period, the Council has still managed to 'virtually' meet on a number of occasions. We have been able to do this because of a change in legislation that now allows Council meetings to go ahead on a virtual basis. Using Microsoft Teams, meetings have been able to take place whilst also allowing members of the public to virtually attend. On 18 May, the Council held its Annual Council Meeting which not only established the membership of all our Committees for the year ahead but also meant that the new Town Mayor, Councillor Peter Hollick, could be elected. Central Bedfordshire Council has been administering the two Covid-19 business grants schemes;

Small Business Grant Fund

This is a £10,000 grant for all business in receipt of small business rate relief or rural rate relief.

Retail, Hospitality and Leisure Grant Fund

This grant scheme offers companies in these sectors:

- a grant of £10,000 available for businesses with a rateable value of less than £15,000
- a £25,000 grant for those businesses with a rateable value of £15,000 or more, but less than £51,000

More than £32m has been distributed through these schemes in Central Bedfordshire and we are proactively contacting eligible businesses which haven't applied yet.

Priory House Prepares For Your Return







All the staff at Priory House have been missing our customers and friends and hope that all are keeping safe and well.

The Management Team here are taking measures to re-open areas of the house in a safe and sensible manner, which protects both our staff and customers.

The first area to open, from 15 June, will be the TIC and Gift Shop; things will look very different as we have already had the safety screens installed courtesy of our fantastic Town Rangers and we will be putting a one way system and social distancing markings in place. The pretty faces and handsome features will be hidden behind protective facemasks but you will no doubt recognise them if you're one of our regular visitors!

Screens for the Tea Rooms will be installed in the next few weeks ready for when we can reopen, hopefully from 6 July. It is likely that initially there will be a limited menu and service to start with.

Both the Gift Shop and the Tea Rooms will accept card payments only, in order to protect both staff and customers there will be no cash handling. In order to make this easier we have had our card machines updated so that the contactless payments have been increased to a maximum £45 per transaction.

The Tea Rooms will reopen in July as long as the Government Guidelines at that time allow it and we have all necessary measures in place. Again this will involve two metre social distancing and no cash handling. Unfortunately in order for this to happen the number of tables will have to be drastically reduced but when the weather allows we will have additional tables and chairs outside.

All areas of Priory House which are open will be fully risk assessed and conform to the 'Working through Covid' Government Guidelines.

Confirmed opening dates and times will be published on the Dunstable Town Council website and also through our various social media platforms.

During the lockdown period we have taken the opportunity to upskill the staff in various ways, all the staff have completed an Introduction to Coffee course which means they will be able to better advise customers about the different whole bean speciality coffees on the menu and little snippets of interesting information about coffee to enhance your experience.

The Catering Manager has been working on a new vegan/dairy free menu which will be introduced and our baking team have been finding, and trialling, new recipes to extend our home bakes with more gluten free and vegan options. Their families have been enjoying sampling the different options and making helpful suggestions!

One member of staff has researched and produced a crib sheet for all the staff to use about a potted history of Priory House so that they are more able to answer the various questions our customers ask about the building and the people who have owned it over the past eight centuries.

The Duty Managers have been keeping in touch with our wedding couples and the Registrars, those who have bookings for various other celebrations and our Afternoon Tea customers, together with liaising with the Town Guides about Tea Time Tales and Town Walks.

We are all looking forward to seeing each other and our regular customers very soon; until then please keep safe and stay well one and all.

During the Coronavirus lockdown period the Council's grounds staff managed to keep on top of grass cutting in all the parks and recreation grounds and Dunstable Cemetery. The team also managed to empty litter and dog waste bins on a regular basis and keep most areas as free from litter as possible.

The spring floral displays were a delight to see when in full bloom and we hope that people out on their daily exercise were able to

enjoy them.

Plans are still in place to install and plant this year's summer floral displays and we hope that residents and visitors will enjoy these as we emerge from the lockdown.

Our team at Dunstable Cemetery have continued to provide a burial service throughout the lockdown period and will continue to do so with dignity and respect. Families are reminded that at the moment only immediate family should attend a funeral in line with Government guidance.

Our children's playgrounds have been shut during lockdown, in line with Government regulations and will remain so until the Government eases the restrictions. However, the tennis courts at Bennett Memorial Recreation Ground are now open again and people are asked to follow the current guidelines on safe use.

The Anglia in Bloom and Britain in Bloom campaigns have been cancelled for 2020 and will resume again in 2021. The Anglia in Bloom organisers are holding a virtual competition and photographs of the town's achievements will be submitted for the judges to view.

Dunstable in Bloom are still planning to hold the local garden competition and there is still time to enter your front garden, basket, and container displays. We know that it has been difficult for some to get hold of plants, but others have grown their own whilst in lockdown and with garden centres now open again, we hope that you will still enter.

Our Town Rangers are up and running again in the town centre and throughout the town helping to keep areas tidy and weed free. They are still able to assist with most environmental issues so do call or Facebook as before.

Working with the Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) COVID 19 Hub resident referral process, and in partnership with the Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity (BRCC), Town Council officers have been making daily phone calls to vulnerable residents who require some form of ongoing support.

From the CBC Covid-19 Hub, where resident's needs are initially dealt with, the Town Council then receives a list of daily phone calls to make. These calls are to provide a number of

ongoing support mechanisms such as regular shopping trips and prescription collections. A key partner in this process is the Dunstable Good Neighbours Scheme who have been assisting with many of these ongoing support needs. Calls also check on the general well-being of the residents and reassurance that they are not alone. Town Council officers will also be listening to any other concerns and problems where onward advice and support can be provided. If required residents are put on a weekly call back list, again reassurance for them that someone will be checking that they are alright or for just a regular friendly chat.

Town Council officers are making on average 100 calls to residents per week.

Dunstable Town Council's officers have also been able to respond to specific and ad hoc emergency calls for assistance from residents via the CBC Covid-19 Hub.







Community Action Bedfordshire is the accredited Volunteer Centre for Central Bedfordshire, we are working in partnership with Central Bedfordshire Council, Dunstable Town Council and other partner organisations to support with coordinating the COVID-19 response.
