This posed one of many challenges over the years. They diversified by opening an off-licence increasing their convenience food range.

'The latest challenge, Covid-19, has really brought the local community together. News delivery agents were classed as 'key workers' so we have been open throughout lockdown. Our customers and neighbours have been so very supportive throughout this difficult time. I would like to thank them all.'
