When Barrie left retail, his own children too young to take over the business, he sold it to his assistant, Russell Kelly. He had joined the team on leaving school in September 1988. 9 years of experience under his belt, Russell was more than ready to take on the challenge.

I have developed an online presence while maintaining a reputation for excellent customer service. Octave is still a family business in every sense;, I met my wife in the shop and she supports me behind the scenes - repainting the walls during a refurbishment; writing adverts and even producing Covid safe signage!"
