The majority of my working life was spent as a health visitor but I was a College Lecturer in Health studies for ten years when my daughter was at school. During this time I gained an Open University Degree and a Teaching Certificate. The last few years before retiring I spent most of my time involved with domestic violence and child protection cases, and training new health visitors.

It is for that reason that my charity for this year is Home-Start. Home-Start provides vital support services to families with young children in Central Bedfordshire and we have their base here in Dunstable.

It is one of the leading family support charities in the UK. Since 1984 the charity has been helping local young children and their families struggling to cope with...

- Bereavement
- Hunger, poor nutrition, neglect ...and more


It helps families to work towards increased confidence and independence by offering support, friendship and practical assistance. The support is often based directly in the family home as well as group work.

Reflections on an **Unusual Mayoral Year**

In 'usual' times the Town Mayor attends many social and civic occasions, either his/her own or accepting invitations from, amongst others, other Mayors. There may also be talks to various groups like Rotary, Scouts/Guides, Forces Cadet groups or schools. At social occasions raffles are held to raise money for the Mayor's chosen charities.

In 'extraordinary' times, (given the past pandemic year), there were no face-to-face events (coffee mornings, dinners, quiz/ race night etc.) and there were no such civic events (Mayor Making, Remembrance Sunday and Civic Service etc.) and no raffles. There were just a few 'socially distanced' events, including Town Council Long Service Awards and a Thanksgiving Service for HRH the Duke of Edinburgh.

So, what did I really do? I had to make something of my Mayoral Year and wanted to raise money for my charities.

My writing fortnightly articles in the Dunstable Gazette about local family businesses, was a regular and positive support for these important outlets in our town. These articles can also be found on the Town Council website.

I wrote a weekly diary about my engagements, also published on the website. For most days of each week, I was able to report on something I had done - attending briefings, virtual Council meetings and chairing full Council meetings; attending meetings of other bodies to which I had been appointed. Between lockdowns, accompanied by the Mayoress, Ann Sparrow, we welcomed shops re-opening and visited stallholders at the Town Markets. I visited all the town centre shops and those on the out-of-town shopping parades before Christmas. I opened some fourteen new shops and businesses.

It was particularly pleasing to present six long service awards to staff recognising 20 years and 10 years service.

The charities for my year were Hospice at Home, Air Cadets and Autism Bedfordshire (Dunstable projects). Not having any of the usual social events due to the pandemic at which monies would have been raised, I decided to hold a public Mayor's Charity Raffle. In a short time and after another lockdown, this raised £1,417. I am grateful to the shops, fellow councillors and others who sold tickets and gave raffle prizes. Together with proceeds from my Golf Day – the one social event I did manage to hold in October - the total raised was £1,688 to be divided equally between those three charities.

For people to say there is nothing in Dunstable is a disservice to all those working hard to provide services and everyday needs for the residents of Dunstable through the variety of shops and businesses we do have. It also demeans the work of the Council which provides services and leisure opportunities for local people - especially our Youth Service, lunches and coffee mornings for our elderly residents, our award-winning gardens, our skate park, cycle track, splash park, adventure play area and Creasey Park Community Football Centre. Other opportunities are available for the young, the elderly and when we can hold them, for the family at our celebrated events and markets.

It is pleasing that during the past difficult year many new shops and businesses opened: Coppersmith (recruitment), Kazmicks (relocated restaurant), Sundon Model Shop (relocated from Luton), Dariela Cakes and Café, Dariela Bakery, Shreeji International (Asian and African fruit, vegetables and other products), Cratita Vesela (Romanian café), Kumon (relocated English and maths tuition), The Coffee Pod (Coffee House and café), Red Thread Tailor (mending, tailoring, guilting, crafting, repairs and embellishment), Sperring Residential (estate agent), The Crown on Route 66 (refurbished Crown Public House). Neville Funeral Services and Blue Heart Clinics on Ashton Square (Health and Wellbeing - Physiotherapy, Acupuncture etc.). Soon to open is The Taste of Lahore in the Quadrant Centre. One recently opened business is already seeking new premises to expand. There is positive life in Dunstable!

I do thank my fellow Councillors (including those representing Dunstable on Central Bedfordshire) and officers of the Town Council for their support and, not least of all, I thank my Mayoress, Ann Sparrow, for her support.

My year ended on 17 May, so my support has now been given to our new Mayor and her Consort. I look back on my very different Mayoral year than that I had in 2016-17 with a feeling I have - in spite of the circumstances - been able to do something positive.







Giving back your **High Street**

It's an exciting time for Dunstable High Street. Shopping in the town centre is no longer just about the 'butcher, baker and candlestick maker', people want a pleasant experience with a social aspect.

Central Bedfordshire Council want to create an environment which will encourage residents and workers to spend more time in their town centre and support local businesses. They want to reduce the sense of vehicles dominating the road. give greater priority to pedestrians and cyclists, and improve accessibility.

Over the last 18 months, the Council have been making improvements to Middle Row, Ashton Square, High Street South and Queensway, including improving the drainage to reduce the risk of flooding which the area has been prone to in the past.

Thanks to funding support from the South East Midlands Local Enterprise Partnership with an allocation from the Local Growth Fund, High Street North will be remodelled, the traffic light timings changed, and a four-way crossing installed at Church Street, West Street and Dunstable High Street.

The High Street will also be revitalised, with broader pavements, improving the central reservation, with more plants, cycle parking and benches.

An Integrated Health and Care Hub and new homes for Dunstable, opening in 2023

Construction has started on a brand-new communityfocused Integrated Health and Care Hub in Dunstable. Situated behind GO Bowling off Court Drive, this exciting development will bring together a mix of professionals to provide joined-up health and care services for the residents of Dunstable, surrounding areas and villages.

It will host a wide range of services including primary care services, community and mental health services and social care for children and adults. Central Bedfordshire Council is working closely with Bedfordshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes Clinical Commissioning Group and East London NHS Foundation Trust on the development to achieve its vision of improving the health and wellbeing of residents, through greater integration and partnership working.

This development includes 98 affordable new homes for older people looking to live in modern, town centre accommodation. The Council has an ambitious plan to increase the amount of affordable housing in Central Bedfordshire, and this development will provide one and two bedroom homes for over 55s, who will have all the benefits of the health and care services on their doorsteps.

As part of the development a special graffiti board will be in place near the neighbouring skate park, as an initiative to encourage budding local artists with a space for them to tag. Walking access to Dog Kennel Walk will also be maintained throughout the development of the site, which is expected to conclude in March 2023.

Here's an unusual view of part of the splendid interior of Dunstable's Queensway Hall, taken in 1964. The hall had two spacious bar areas, with one situated at the top of the staircase seen here, well away from the noisy dance floor.

It created a sophisticated and civilised venue, ideal for the kind of event seen in this photo. Dinner-dances were once extremely popular, and the hall thrived until these fell out of favour.

But meanwhile the hall's auditorium had proved unsuitable for most stage shows and despite some very successful rock concerts (David Bowie famously appeared there as Ziggy Stardust) bookings fell away. One critic complained about a musical that it was well-nigh impossible to see what was happening from his seat at the back. In its final years, up to 2000, the hall was empty on most nights.

South Bedfordshire District Council faced with the looming cost of repairs to the hall roof, welcomed an offer from a supermarket to lease the site, with the money to be used to build a replacement entertainment venue. Today's Grove Theatre and Asda store are the result.

Remember to make it a healthy experience splash please observe all the health and safety notices displayed around the splash park and café.





We hope everyone has heard the good news about the High Street Heritage Action Zone (HSHAZ) but just in case you missed it- Dunstable is 1 of 67 historic high streets across England to have secured government funding from the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) and Ministry for Housing Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) as part of the HSHAZ programme. Until the end of March 2024 Dunstable Town Council will be working with Historic England and several other partners to deliver the HSHAZ programme with the hope of enhancing and revitalise our high street.

The HSHAZ programme involves building refurbishment, community engagement and a cultural programme.

The Cultural Programme will be designed and led by a local Cultural Consortium who have separate funding, working with Historic England in partnership with the National Lottery Heritage Fund and Arts Council England. The Dunstable Cultural Consortium, (the Consortium) will be planning and delivering the cultural programme.



As we emerge from the latest lockdown caused by the Covid 19 pandemic the Council is again working with Dunstable in Bloom to help make Dunstable a better place to live, work and visit.

The 2021 campaign has adopted a new slogan 'A Bright New Start' and In Bloom volunteers are once again out and about doing their bit for the environment.

Welcome to Katherine Doyle, our new Parks and Green Space Development Officer

Katherine Doyle joined the Council as the new Parks and Green Space Development Officer in February this year and has been busy getting to grips with a number of projects and initiatives that will benefit the town's residents and green spaces.

Katherine started her career in the fashion and textiles industry having obtained a degree from Brighton Polytechnic. In the 1990's she decided to change careers and studied horticulture at Capel Manor College in Enfield, specialising in organic gardening.

Katherine's first horticultural job was at Ryton Organic Gardens near Coventry (now known as Garden Organic) where she became Deputy Head Gardener. She then moved on to become Gardener-in-Charge at the National Trust Godolphin Garden in Cornwall. This was followed by taking up the position of Deputy Head Gardener at the well-known Chelsea Physic Garden where she worked closely with horticulture trainees, apprentices and volunteers.

In 2013 Katherine moved back into pure organic gardening as the Senior Gardener at a 70 acre private organic and wildlife garden in Oxfordshire. She has a passion for the natural world, people, animals and plants and has successfully managed gardens and estates to ensure that wildlife is protected and nurtured using sustainable organic gardening principles.

Katherine's role with the Council will see her undertake a wide range of green space projects over the next few years in line with the Councils Corporate Plan and the Council's desire to further improve its open spaces and build on the achievements so far. These projects will include:

Improving The Lives Of Others

Dunstable Town FC and Becoming a Social Enterprise, Community Benefits Society

Dunstable Town FC have an interesting history. Formed in 1883 the Club had several homes before finding permanent residency at Creasey Park in the post-war years.

Those of a certain vintage may have witnessed the mercurial magic of George Best when he graced the hallowed turf of Creasey Park in 1974, playing three times for the Blues as a favour to his old Manchester United teammate, Barry Fry, who was the Club's Manager. Fry, in his first job in football management went on to manage Barnet, Birmingham City & Peterborough Utd, where he is Director of Football.

Kerry Dixon is another former England International who started his career at Dunstable Town, before going on to play for Reading & then heading to the bright lights of London's Kings Road, where he scored 193 times for Chelsea making him the Club's all-time third most prolific goal scorer.

The global Covid pandemic wrought havoc and despair to the lives of millions. While the nation mourned the lives of countless thousands, many of the Club's commercial sponsors saw their own business' and livelihoods severely affected by lockdowns and the cessation of normal trading.

Dunstable Town became managed by the Club's fans in 2017. Many clubs, even at non-league level, rely heavily on the generosity of individual donors to keep their clubs afloat. As tenants of the Council and with no individual benefactors that is simply not an option for Dunstable Town.

Therefore in order to protect the Club's history and ensure a sustainable future we will now start the new season in August as a Community Benefits Society (CBS).

Regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority, the Club will operate as a social enterprise combining both traditional football activities with working in our local communities on improving the mental and physical health and well-being of individuals.

Supporters, and members of the general public, have the opportunity to become owners of Dunstable Town FC. By simply purchasing a maximum of one share per person a supporter automatically becomes an owner of Dunstable Town FC.

It's a scheme that has been championed by League clubs like AFC Wimbledon, Newport County, and Exeter City, it is the ultimate manifestation of fan power and the pinnacle of supporter commitment to become an owner of the Club you support. Owners automatically get voting rights on electing the Club's Board of Directors every year, choosing new kit and consulted on future plans for the Club.

For less than the price of a couple of cinema tickets and a bag of popcorn you can become an owner of Dunstable Town FC and support the great work we're doing with our partners improving the lives of others. Children's ownership is half price but has no voting rights until aged 16.
