

It was always going to be a busy start to the year with the Queen's Jubilee celebrations, but I'm not sure I expected to be covering 16 events in 4 days! It was wonderful to see so many residents come together with their neighbours to hold Street Parties; thank you to those who made both my Deputy and I so welcome, and sorry to those we did not get to hear about or visit.

The sudden loss of HM Queen Elizabeth II on 8 September has left a void in our lives. Her Late Majesty was certainly a true example of putting others before herself. I am immensely proud of the way the town reacted to her passing, in particular the arrangements made to bring the community together with the Proclamation reading and the Service of Thanksgiving at the Priory Church. The events across the town have been extremely well supported. Events take time to organise and execute and our Events Officer, Gina, has done a fantastic job in ensuring all has gone smoothly. Likewise, events at Priory House, Middle Row Markets and Grove Corner have all been excellent, attracting families to the town centre who have, in turn, supported local business. This has been the result of great team work, thanks to everyone involved.

Christmas is almost upon us and in this edition you can see all the activities we have planned. My Christmas Card Competition was a great success, the winning designs can be seen on the Town Council Facebook page.

Having taken on the role of Town Clerk and Chief Executive at the beginning of August, I was immediately thrown into welcoming the judges for Dunstable's Britain in Bloom entry. I can't imagine a more impressive introduction; the number of volunteers who work so hard all year, along with Town Council staff and our partners, to provide such an impressive range of displays and planting throughout the town is remarkable.

The sad death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and the almost immediate Proclamation ceremony to mark the start of the reign of King Charles III, provided an opportunity to find out how well prepared the town was, and how well the Town Council, Central Bedfordshire Council, the Priory Church of St. Peter and all our partners can pull together with little notice to make things happen.

I'm looking forward to taking part in the coming year of events and activities in the town, starting with the Christmas Carols and Torchlight Procession on 25 November, followed by our Twilight Markets from 9 to 11 December.

As well as being the Council's Chief Executive, I am also the Town Clerk, and will be wearing the traditional Clerk's wig and gown for civic events, starting with the Remembrance parade and service on Sunday 13 November.

We will be supporting a national campaign encouraging residents to stand in the May 2023 local town council elections. I look forward to working with the Council and our partners to develop our services, events, and activities for the coming years.

On Friday 29 July, Britain in Bloom judges Ann Holland and Geraldine King visited Dunstable. They were taken on a tour around the town by John Crawley, Head of Grounds and Environmental Services, and Dunstable in Bloom chairman Hugh Garrod. During their visit to the Tudor Gardens at The Old Palace Lodge Hotel, they had time for a quick interview with one of our Officers.

**Jemma (interviewer):** What are you looking for from the Dunstable entry to be able to give us a Gold award?

Geraldine: What we're looking for in all of the Large Towns, which is the category Dunstable is a part of, is three main things. The first is horticultural excellence. Second, we're looking for good environmental practices, things like manual weeding, not using harsh chemicals, composting, bird boxes, encouraging pollinators, and of course, promoting sustainability. But the most important element, because the RHS is very much about encouraging communities to get involved, is how the community is supporting the town, and how they get involved in looking after the town. Some examples Dunstable have shown us already is the Men in Sheds project, the various local charity groups you've been working with, the Queen's Green Canopy tree planting, and we've only just started the tour!

**J:** How long have you been judging for Britain in Bloom, and what's the most rewarding thing about being a judge?

Ann: I'll start this because I'm the younger of the two us... judging wise (laugh). I started actually judging in 2017, but I've come from the other side in that I used to compete in Britain in Bloom; I was Chairlady for ten years prior to that. So, I know exactly how you all feel because

I've been on the other side. So yes, I've been doing it since 2017, so 5 years. And then, you (Geraldine) are a bit of a perennial, as they say.

**G:** That's very polite! (Laugh). So, I've been a regional judge for about 24 years, and my region was London in Bloom. But I have been a national judge for about 6 or 7 years now. And well, I love meeting people, and seeing the way that people, in their own way, change and grow their towns. No two towns or villages are the same. It's also lovely the range of people we meet from varying backgrounds!

I think for both of us, because we do a lot of gardening and horticulture, we feel like we're giving back, because this is voluntary. There are 17 RHS Britain in Bloom judges on the road now, and all of them are giving up their time to give back to the community on behalf of the RHS

**J:** Why is Britain in Bloom so important to the many local communities that take part every year?

**A:** It gives a focus to your year, and ties everything together. I think it's something that can be celebrated!

**G:** Absolutely, and what the RHS are trying to do is encourage more people to try gardening, and what we've established is that gardening can have health and wellbeing benefits. From things like stress, to decluttering your mind. But the In Bloom competition is a way of rewarding communities for the work they would be doing anyway; it's nice to give back.

**J:** Does judging get harder every year, and how has it changed since the pandemic?

**G:** Well, this is the first time we've been out judging in two years. It's hard because, at this

level, you're the best of the best. Cracking well done to Dunstable, because there are so many Large Towns in the UK, and Dunstable is one of only 8 that has been nominated as a finalist, which is a massive credit to your work. I would say what's really changed is how people think about plants, particularly in terms of sustainability and pollinators. What we're seeing more of is people thinking about why they're planting something. I think there's also been a lot of fun introduced since COVID, like your quirky wheelbarrows celebrating the Jubilee!

J: What is your favourite flower and why?

**A:** I'm going to say perennial geranium, because it will grow anywhere; you can find a geranium for any position in your garden! It also comes in a range of colours, and it's a pollinator!

**G:** I'm one of the UK directors of the International Camellia Society, so I'm going to say Camellia, which are spring flowering. But I love it because it's a fantastic plant in your garden, and for me it announces spring has arrived and summer is coming!

Dunstable won the Large Town category and a gold medal. The town also received a certificate of recognition for the Sustainable Gardening Award.





# DUNSTABLE HIGH STREET HERITAGE ACTION ZONE

The High Street Heritage Action Zone (HSHAZ) is now almost halfway through its third year and ends in March 2024.

The HSHAZ programme involves building grants and refurbishment, community engagement and Cultural Programme led by the Dunstable Cultural Consortium (DCC) who have a Facebook Page

Building grants and refurbishment in the HSHAZ area during 2021 and 2022 up to early September 2022 has included:

- Repair work to 18 High Street South (which might be remembered as Chilli and Spice)
- Contribution to the refurbishment works to the Market Cross clock tower and contribution to the Methodist Church garden

There has also been detailed survey work and specialist work at

4 High Street South (known as former butchers Tilley's), initial feasibility studies in relation to six properties and design work.

#### REFURBISHMENT WORKS **TO PRIORY HOUSE**

Priory House is currently on Historic England's Heritage At Risk Register, primarily relating to the deterioration of the stonework in the Undercroft.

It is anticipated that this project, which is being led by the Morton Partnership (Conservation Accredited Structural Engineers) will allow for Priory House's removal from the At Risk Register. The repair work started on 12 September 2022 and is scheduled to run for approximately nine to ten months.
