





Welcome to the spring edition of Talk of the Town. This is always a very important time of year for the Council as it is the period in which the Council agrees its annual budget. This year the Council has had to make extensive cost saving efficiencies to keep the increase as low as possible, in light of considerable increases in the cost of gas and electricity across our venues. I am pleased that these savings have been achieved without any significant impact on direct service provision and that there will only be a moderate increase in the Town Council element of the council tax charge. If you live in a Band D property in Dunstable you will pay an annual charge of £209.49, which is an increase of £21.83 per year, or 42p per week.

The spring sees the launch of the Council's events programme and this year we will be kicking things off with St. George's Day celebrations in Priory Gardens on 22 April. Details of all the Council's events planned for this year are given later in this edition.

Elections for the Town Council will take place on Thursday 4 May along with elections for Central Bedfordshire Council. Do use your vote! This year, for the first time, you will be required to show an accepted form of photo identification to be able to vote. The deadline for applications for Voter Authority Certificates is 5 pm on Wednesday 26 April. Information about what you need and how to register are included at page 15.

We are looking forward to celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III. Come down to Priory Gardens to celebrate and watch the coronation broadcast live on a large screen with on-site catering and an outdoor bar on Saturday 6 May. We will be putting up Union Flags and bunting in time for the weekend. Middle Row Markets will have a coronation theme on 13 May, with free crazy royal golf, arts and crafts and free face-painting.

How we spend your money

The Town Council is funded through a small portion of the Council Tax known as a precept and by income it generates.

Did you know that of your annual 2023/24 council tax bill, only £209.49 (Band D properties) is paid to Dunstable Town Council? This will be an increase of £21.83 per year, or 42p per week from 2022/23. The increase is due to the rising costs of energy and salary cost increases.

DUNSTABLE HIGH STREET HERITAGE ACTION ZONE

The High Street Heritage Action Zone (HSHAZ) is now at the end of its third year and the HSHAZ ends in March 2024. The HSHAZ programme involves building grants and refurbishment, community engagement and Cultural Programme led by the Dunstable Cultural Consortium (DCC) who have a Facebook page at DunstableCulturalConsortium.

REFURBISHMENT WORKS TO PRIORY HOUSE



Priory House is currently on Historic England's Heritage At Risk Register, primarily relating to the deterioration of the stonework in the Undercroft.

It is anticipated that this project, which is being led by the Morton Partnership (Conservation Accredited Structural Engineers) will allow for Priory House's removal from the At Risk Register. The repair work started on 12 September 2022.

A New Tiny Forest for Mentmore Recreation Ground

On Saturday 17 December 2022 Earthwatch Europe, in partnership with Dunstable Town Council and Central Bedfordshire Council, held a community planting day to create a Tiny Forest at Mentmore Recreation Ground. The Tiny Forest is funded by the Local Authority Treescapes Fund and is the first of its kind to be planted in Central Bedfordshire!

Approximately forty local people helped to plant six hundred trees, along with the Town Mayor Cllr.
