
The Council is currently recruiting for a range of roles, so do take a look at the vacancies section on the website.



NEW BEGINNINGS FOR FC DUNSTABL

Back in February AFC Dunstable chairman Simon Bullard vowed to give his beloved Club away for free, as long as it was to the right owners who had its best interests at heart

Mr Bullard had been part of AFC Dunstable, who play their home games at Creasey Park, for going on 30 years. Fast forward to June 2023 and the Club is in new hands, with new owners and a new first team management.

So, just who is the organisation looking after the Bedfordshire Southern League Division One Central side?

Soccer Assist - an organisation that helps students from the UK get scholarships to study and play football (or soccer as they call it) in the United States of America.

Co-founders Tyrelle McLeod-Bentley and Junior Osei-Tutu have been playing and working in football their whole lives. They both grew up in London before meeting overseas on a US scholarship in West Virginia, America. It was there where they decided to start up the Scholarship agency company and build a successful footballing programme in Milton Keynes.

Having built a strong community based business they now plan on bringing their knowledge and experience to Bedfordshire where they want to carry on the traditions of AFC Dunstable whilst elevating the club further

Speaking of the new custodians of the Club, Simon Bullard said: "Junior and his colleagues share an ethos and direction of where we want the club to be and to continue its growth. Soccer Assist recognise that we are a community focused club with aspirations to move forward with all our teams from the junior academy, under 7s right through to the first team and ladies section. We look forward to working with Junior and his team at an exciting time for both parties."

Speaking of the take-over, Junior Osei-Tutu

A key part of Soccer Assist's takeover vision is to involve all committee members who wish to remain as part of the club.

Celebrating 10 years of the Dunstable Physic Garden

This year marks the 10th anniversary of the Dunstable Physic Garden which is located in Priory Gardens.

The garden was designed and created in 2013 by a local volunteer and garden designer, Deborah Bird. This was part of a wider Medieval Dunstable project celebrating 800 years of the Augustinian Priory. All of the plants included in the garden are authentic to the medieval period and have been chosen following extensive research about the types of plants grown at this time and how they were used.



The garden was planted by local volunteers on a fine, dry Spring morning in 2013 and was formally opened with the ceremonial planting of a Pomegranate by the Mayor, Cllr Pat Staples. The Pomegranate is symbolically associated with Catherine of Aragon, Henry VIII's first wife.

The garden is split into 6 separate sections each containing plants for different uses or to treat different ailments. The 6 areas are Dye Plants, A Flowery Mead, A Scented Herber, Coughs, Colds and Flu, Headaches and Restorative Tonics, Digestion and Liver, Bladder and Kidneys.

For the last 10 years a small, dedicated team of volunteer

gardeners has cared for the garden, meeting once a week to weed, prune, dead head and replace plants, so that visitors to Priory Gardens can enjoy a wonderful yearround display.

In Easter 2020 the garden was featured in the BBC "Heavenly Gardens" programme filmed with Arit Anderson, a British garden designer, and it was first aired on Good Friday.

All of the plants have label markers, and the interpretation panel provides lots of information about the plants and how they were used in medieval times. As part of the 10 year celebration the panel is being upgraded to include a QR code which can be scanned to offer visitors even more information.

At the St George's day celebrations, held in Priory Gardens in April, the volunteers and Dunstable in Bloom joined forces to promote their volunteer work, give out seeds to create Flowery Meads at home and educate young people about the plants.

The Council would like to thank and congratulate all of the volunteers who have helped to care for the garden over the last 10 years.







Dunstable Cemetery Sanctums and Memorial Plaques Available

Have you recently been bereaved and are unsure what to do with the cremated remains of your loved one? Should they be buried somewhere or scattered in a special place or does that not appeal to you?

Sanctum vaults provide the ideal opportunity to place your loved one's cremated remains in a small above ground stone chamber with a personalised plaque and a place for flowers to be laid.

The Sanctum vaults are made of Sera Grey polished granite and have a removable internal shelf to allow the interment of one or two sets of cremated remains. The plaque on the front can be personalised to include an inscription and a photo, motif or emblem of your choice.

Families sometimes just need a focal point to remember a loved one or lay flowers, even if they are buried elsewhere. The new memorial kerb plaque garden area at Dunstable Cemetery provides an opportunity to place a memorial plaque on a polished granite kerb around an attractive feature flowerbed. The area is easy to reach via gently sloping footpaths which are ideal for visitors with mobility difficulties.



The sanctums and the memorial kerb plaques can be leased or placed for a period of either 25 or 35 years for a one-off payment which includes the plaque and where applicable the interment.

DUNSTABLE HIGH STREET HERITAGE ACTION ZONE

The High Street Heritage Action Zone (HSHAZ) is now in its fourth and final year ending March 2024. The HSHAZ programme involves building grants, refurbishment and community engagement led by the Town Council. It also involves a Cultural Programme led by the Dunstable Cultural Consortium (DCC) who have a Facebook Page @DunstableCulturalConsortium.

Building Grants and Refurbishment in the HSHAZ Area

During the third year, the HSHAZ grant money was used to undertake a gutter clearance project along the even side of High Street South from 2 to 38. This was the first time the Dunstable HSHAZ supported any general maintenance work. Water ingress due to blocked gutters can have a real adverse impact on old buildings so this work was beneficial to a number of buildings in the HSHAZ area. We also continued to work with the owner of 21 to 23 High Street South. During the third year the focus of this work involved reviewing the existing shopfront designs. Conception Architects have been working away behind the scenes on a new shopfront design and in early May 2023 a Section 73 Planning Application was submitted for a new shopfront. Refurbishment Works to Priory House

Priory House is currently on Historic England's Heritage At Risk Register, primarily relating to the deterioration of the stonework in the Undercroft. The repair work started on 12 September 2022 and it was hoped that it would run for approximately nine to ten months. However, the repair work to date has revealed lots of hidden challenges, this and other factors such as needing to source more stone for the repairs has resulted in delays. At the time of writing, there are still some challenges and the Morton Partnership (Conservation Accredited Structural Engineers) and the project team are busy undertaking investigations to inform the ongoing repair methodology.
