This year's Summer Activities Programme by Dunstable Town Council has provided opportunities for young people of all ages to engage in activities and learn new skills. It was wonderful to see so many enjoying the Zorb Football and the Inflatable Day in particular. Likewise, the excellent events held throughout the summer have been very well attended and enjoyed by thousands of residents.

Middle Row Markets go from strength to strength and continue to bring in new traders with varying craft items to increase the offering to our residents. Our Street Food Markets have been hugely successful and I look forward to them returning in 2024.

It's been another award-winning year with the council achieving a fourth Green Flag for Bennett Memorial Recreational Ground. The parks and gardens have been well maintained by the Council's Grounds Team and supported by the volunteers of Dunstable in Bloom. We were once again given a Gold Award for this year's entry to Anglia In Bloom, which is a testament to all the hard work and effort that goes into each passing year.

I've attended lots of events since starting my second term of office in May. It's been a pleasure to have given several talks at various locations on the History of Dunstable Mayors and Street Names, including two of the Town Council's Older People's Lunch Clubs. It was lovely to engage in conversation and help them take a trip down memory lane. I must thank John Chatterley for his "loan" of his talk on the history of Mayor's - his research goes right back to 1865.

I'm pleased to see the redevelopment of the Kingsbury Avenue Recreational Ground playground. There is a whole new range of equipment for all ages and abilities. Accessibility was an important design factor for the park and choosing the right equipment. Hopefully, you will agree, it looks fabulous. The kickabout Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) further enhances the park and provides additional facilities for young people to enjoy.

I've held three very successful charity fundraisers since the last time I wrote, and thank everyone who has attended, donated raffle prizes and sponsored my events. The Quiz Night in August was a huge success with 86 quizzers at Creasey Park Community Football Centre. The annual Golf Day was very well supported by local businesses and organisations and sponsorship alone raised more than £2000. A more sedate Ploughman's Supper evening took place in Grove House in October, and my last event of 2023 is at Vantage on the 30 November with a Twist of Abba to finish the evening off. It's been lovely to see new faces coming along to the events and taking part - thank you!

Looking ahead, we turn our minds to the festive season with the Annual Torchlight Procession, carols on The Square, and the wellestablished Twilight Markets Weekend. The lights switch on early in Town, to encourage visitors to support the traders in what is always a challenging time. Please do support the town and shop locally!

Welcome to the winter edition of Talk of the Town. This edition features heavily on all the Town Council is doing in the run-up to Christmas. I encourage all readers to shop local as well as take advantage of everything that Priory House and Middle Row Markets have to offer. The Twilight Markets grow each year, so do put the 8, 9 and 10 December in your diary - all the details are on page 6.

Party in the Park marked my first 12 months in my role. I am incredibly proud of the Town Council; our hard-working staff and Councillors have continued to deliver an excellent range of services, facilities, and green spaces. I've been particularly impressed by the quality, number and range of events held in the town. These include our large town centre events, but also regular market activities, band concerts and the summer activities programme. Next spring will see the end of the High Street Heritage Action Zone project, which has enabled us to add all kinds of attractions and activities to our usual programme. We are already looking for ways to continue some of this added value in the years ahead.

The Town Council has deservedly been awarded a fourth Green Flag, this time for Bennetts Memorial Recreation Ground, alongside Priory Gardens, Grove House Gardens and Dunstable Cemetery.

The High Street Heritage Action Zone (HSHAZ) project has provided much of the funding and the opportunity to carry out restoration works to Priory House. As work has progressed additional concerns have been identified. Council staff have worked hard, along with colleagues including from Central Bedfordshire Councill and Historic England, to secure additional funding to ensure the long-term future of the building. I have been encouraged through this challenging process to see that Priory House is recognised as a building of national significance, and we are hugely grateful to Historic England for its tenacious support. The works will now continue well into 2024, however, do be assured that the end result will be a safe, restored and sustainable building that future generations will continue to enjoy. For now, Priory House remains open; look out for the new bottomless elevenses!

The Town Council is committed to engaging with residents and being as transparent as possible. We are now live-streaming Council meetings, and Councillors are holding monthly public meetings (surgeries) one ward at a time; more details are available on page 15.


Friends of Dunstable Cemetery



New Kingsbury Playground and Multi Use Games Area

Dunstable Town Council is proud to announce the opening of its brand-new playground and kickabout Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) at Kingsbury Recreation Ground. This much-anticipated redevelopment of the play area and the installation of the MUGA now provides a great focal point for the local community. It offers an array of exciting equipment for children of all ages and abilities to enjoy.

Kingsbury Recreation Ground is located just off Luton Road in East Dunstable. The new playground features slides, swings, multi-play units and play panels. There is inclusive play equipment that caters to individuals of all abilities, including an accessible seesaw and roundabout. There are also designated picnic spots and seating areas. The kickabout MUGA has five-a-side goals, target games and basketball hoops.

The new play area and MUGA were officially opened by Dunstable Town Mayor, Councillor Liz Jones and she said: "I am really pleased to see the redevelopment of the play area and the installation of the Council's first kickabout MUGA. The inclusive play equipment that has been installed alongside many other pieces of equipment provides the opportunity for all to come together and enjoy outdoor play. It's been great to see people making good use of these new facilities and to have received such positive feedback. These new facilities demonstrate the Council's commitment to providing freeto-use high-quality recreational opportunities for local people."

The work has been partly funded through planning contributions from local developments secured by Central Bedfordshire Council. The design and installation were undertaken by Play Innovation who have successfully installed many such facilities in London and across the UK.



Dunstable's Green Flag Line-up Just Got **Even Greener**

Dunstable Town Council has secured a coveted fourth Green Flag for Bennett Memorial Recreation Ground, along with successfully maintaining the prestigious Green Flag for Grove House Gardens, Priory Gardens and Dunstable Cemetery.



Dunstable was awarded another Gold at the recent Anglia in Bloom Awards held this year in Huntingdon. Dunstable Town Mayor, Cllr Liz Jones, attended the award ceremony with Dunstable in Bloom volunteers and Council staff to collect the awards.

Dunstable received yet another Gold award in the Large Town category, as well as thirteen other awards:

- Nominated for the best Grow Your Own Project for Hillcroft Allotments
- Nominated for the best Local Authority Floral Display for Dunstable Town Centre
- Mike Ames certificate of recognition for the Dunstable Wombles for their outstanding work
- Gold and overall winner in the Nature/Conservation Category for Mentmore Recreation Ground Tiny Forest and Hedgerow
- Gold in Nature/Conservation Category for Blows Down BCN Wildlife Trust – SSSI Site
- Gold in the Nature/Conservation Category for St Augustine's Academy Forest Garden
- Gold in the Cemetery/Crematorium Category for Dunstable Cemetery
- Silver Gilt in the Public Park Category for Priory Gardens
- Silver Gilt in the Public Park Category for Grove House Gardens
- Silver Gilt in the King's Coronation Display Category
- Silver Gilt and overall winner in the Assisted Living/Care Home Category for Priory View Independent Living
- Gold in the Pub/Restaurant/Shop Front Category for the floral shop display project

When the judges, Julia Smith and Joan Gibson came to visit the town on 12 July, we took the opportunity to ask them a few questions about judging and the Anglia in Bloom campaign:

What do you feel are the benefits of the Anglia in Bloom Campaign?

Julia Smith: One of the key aspects of this initiative is to foster a sense of community engagement and encourage individuals to actively participate in environmental activities, particularly planting.

What is the strangest mode of transport you've been taken around in whilst judging?

Joan Gibson: During the judging process, I was pleasantly surprised when we were shown around in a classic Morris Minor.

What is a favourite or memorable project that inspired you while judging in the Anglia region?

Julia Smith: I think it's always the children that inspire us. Their curiosity never ceases to amaze me. In their presence, we are reminded of the importance of embracing life with a childlike sense of wonder and resilience.

What are the hallmarks of a Gold entry?

Julia Smith: We prioritise three core pillars, horticultural achievements, environmental responsibility, and community participation. These are essential in evaluating the success and impact of each entrant. Doing well in all three gives the highest results.

How long have you been judging? And What do you enjoy about judging?

Joan Gibson: I have been judging for about 5 years, and Julia has been judging for about ten years. We enjoy it because we love meeting people, and we also get ideas to take back to our own communities.

What is your favourite flower?

Julia Smith: Joan is a florist, so she must have lots and lots of favourite flowers. I think mine is nasturtiums because when I was a child, we used to have nasturtiums in our garden and my mum used to encourage me to go out and find the seeds and choose places to plant them the following year.

Dunstable Town FC achieved Community Benefit Society (CBS) status on July 8 2021. This means that the club's purpose is to be a benefit to the local community. The club operates as a social enterprise and is one of only 46 semi-professional clubs registered with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) to operate in this manner.

We belong to the Community Owned Clubs network of the Football Supporters Association (FSA) which oversees our governance and accountability.

The club has a new hub based at Creasev Park Community Football Centre (CPCFC) and runs a series of support groups every week as part of its programme to improve the lives of others. All our groups are free for people to join and participate in. We're a fan-owned club and use a proportion of each fan's membership payments to help provide community support for up to 140 people every week, which includes nine hours of mental health support for people with lived experience of mental ill-health and in recovery.

We run three mental health peer support groups every week and a support group for people who may be feeling lonely and socially isolated. The latter is a partnership with Titan PCN.

Additionally, we operate three Walking Football groups at CPCFC. One of which is a specialist group for Adults with Complex Needs and in September 2023, we will be providing Walking Football sessions for people living with dementia in collaboration with Tibbs Dementia Foundation.

DUNSTABLE HIGH STREET HERITAGE ACTION ZONE

The High Street Heritage Action Zone (HSHAZ) is now in its final year and ends in March 2024. The HSHAZ programme involves building grants, refurbishment and community engagement led by Dunstable Town Council. It also involves a Cultural Programme led by the Dunstable Cultural Consortium (DCC). Make sure to follow them on Facebook @DunstableCulturalConsortium.

Building Grants and Refurbishment in the HSHAZ Area

During the fourth year of the HSHAZ, we are continuing to work with the owner of 21 to 23 High Street South. Conception Architects have been working away behind the scenes and a Section 73 Planning Application was approved for a new shopfront in July 2023, with a tender opportunity going out at the end of August 2023. It is hoped that the new shopfront will be completed as part of the HSHAZ by the end of March 2024. Refurbishment Works to Priory House

Priory House is currently on Historic England's Heritage at Risk Register, primarily relating to the deterioration of the stonework in the Undercroft. The repair work started on 12 September 2022, and it was hoped that it would run for approximately nine to ten months. However, the repair work to date has revealed lots of hidden challenges and unknown issues which could not have been foreseen until the site work had commenced. It is now hoped that the site work will be completed by the end of summer 2024.

However, there are still some challenges and the Morton Partnership (Conservation Accredited Structural Engineers) and the project team are busy developing the ongoing repair methodology.
