As a Council, we are committed to doing what we can to help our traders, but in turn, we need you as residents to visit our town centre and support them. Our Middle Row Markets and themed activities on The Square returned in March, and whilst this alone won't solve everything, it brings footfall to the town centre regularly and hopefully through the doors of local businesses.

The Lord Lieutenant of Bedfordshire, Susan Lousada, recently spent time in the Town with myself and the Deputy Mayor as we wanted to showcase the number of independent businesses we have as well as our award-winning parks and open spaces.

I've recently led a meeting with the Police and Crime Commissioner, and some of our town councillors, where we challenged him to provide a greater visible police presence in Dunstable. Please report anything you see happening in our community to Bedfordshire police online or via 101. Reports are essential to build case history leading to future outcomes.

The Town Council events programme commences with St George's Day activities and this year's Motor Rally once again coincides with the Truck Convoy. The summer of 2024 looks to be a fantastic reason to stay local, shop local and enjoy our local events!

Welcome to the spring edition of Talk of the Town.

Councillors recently set the annual budget. This year the Council has made extensive cost saving efficiencies. I am pleased that these savings have been achieved without any significant impact on direct service provision and that there will only be a moderate increase in the Town Council element of the council tax charge. If you live in a Band D property in Dunstable you will pay an annual charge of £219.93, which is an increase of £10.44 per year, or 20p

It is disappointing that the Town Council will no longer be managing the Creasey Park Community Football Centre from 1 April. Central Bedfordshire Council has awarded the new contract to the Bedfordshire Football Association and we wish them well as they embark on a new era for the centre, building on the success that has been achieved in the last 13 years.

1 April will also mark the end of the fantastic High Street Heritage Action Zone (HSHAZ) project. Details are on page 12. Dunstable is one of only two town councils to have received funding from the scheme, and we are proud of all the work the Town Council, the Cultural Consortium and our partners have done to promote the town's heritage, improve shop fronts, the public realm and begin work to repair Priory House.

As the Priory House repairs have developed, we have uncovered significant issues which require unforeseen work. Staff and councillors are working hard to ensure that all the necessary works are completed and where necessary further funding is applied for. In the meantime, do look at the HSHAZ section on the Town Council's website for the most recent photos of the works.

I am particularly proud that the Council has achieved a period dignity award in light of the free period products provided in the Ashton Square toilets.





Make New Friends at Dunstable Over 55s Coffee Mornings


The over 55s coffee mornings will return this year on select days throughout April to December and are created specifically for those looking to make new friendships and avoid social isolation.

Trees, Glorious Trees

On Thursday 7 March, thirty climate resilient trees were planted at Mentmore Recreation Ground in Dunstable. The trees were planted by local volunteers, Dunstable Town Council staff and Councillors, members of the Central Bedfordshire Council's (CBC) sustainability team and CBC Councillors.

Over the past two years, the Council have also planted twenty climate resilient trees to celebrate the Queen's Green Canopy initiative, a tiny forest, and a length of native hedgerow.

The latest round of tree planting marked the final phase of the wider tree planting project at Mentmore. The delivery of the project is intended to increase biodiversity, improve climate resilience, and enhance the quality of the park for visitors.



Celebrating the IIIGH STRIFFT

The High Street Heritage Action Zone (HSHAZ) was a four-year government funded scheme which finished at the end of March 2024. Throughout its duration, HSHAZ played a pivotal role in supporting Dunstable Town Council with building grants, refurbishment initiatives, public realm works and community engagement at a range of Dunstable Town Council events, Town Centre events, Middle Row Markets, youth and community projects and many more! We would like to take the opportunity to recap on what the HSHAZ has achieved over the last 4 years...

Building Grants and Refurbishment Projects

18 High Street South

Crucial roof repairs working the Sams Lofts and Opel Estates.

21-23 High Street North (Formerly Moore's)

Repair and restoration of the shopfronts working with Conception Architects, DJ Russell Builders Limited, Dunstable Laminates and Capital Developments Group.

Methodist Church Public Realm Works

Newly planted features to improve the gardens around the Church designed and managed by the Town Council with very generous support and assistance from Henderson and Taylor.

Clock Tower Refurbishment

Repainting the whole structure in its original colours, replacement of the central stone seat, replacing the coats of arms, renewing the lighting, re-glazing the clock faces, re-tiling the floor area and fixing the stone steps. The works were undertaken by David Nott and Sons Limited and overseen by Project Design Studio Limited.

High Street South Maintenance

Cleaning and repairing gutters and rainwater goods from 2 to 38 High Street South working with Braiser Freeth and Hawkins Group Limited.

4 High Street South (Formerly Tillys Butchers)

Specialist structural survey work involving conservation-accredited architects and structural engineers, archaeologists, and other professionals to better inform about the building requirements for repair. Although the project did not continue after the extensive survey work, the building is now better understood and the investigations allowed Historic England to advise that the building remains of significance despite its current condition.

Refurbishment Works at Priory House Heritage Centre and Tea Rooms

Priory House is currently on Historic England's Heritage At Risk Register, primarily relating to the deterioration of the stonework in the medieval Undercroft. The HSHAZ has funded repair works to the Undercroft and the front façade. The repair work started on 12 September 2022, with the hope it would run for approximately nine to ten months. However, since the work started, it has revealed hidden challenges and unknown issues, which could not have been foreseen until site work commenced. The Morton Partnership (Conservation Accredited Structural Engineers) and the project team are tackling the challenges ahead and are busy developing the ongoing repair methodology.

The work to Priory House will continue beyond the HSHAZ with support from two Heritage At Risk Grants and a National Lottery Heritage Fund grant.

End of an Era

After 13 years, Dunstable Town Council will no longer manage Creasey Park Community Football Centre

Dunstable Town Council is disappointed to announce that after 13 years it will end its management of the Creasey Park Community Football Centre on 31 March 2024.

Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC), the owners of the Centre, gave the Town Council notice last autumn. CBC then initiated a tender process for the management of the facility. CBC have been clear throughout that their priority was to raise more money for CBC funds from the Centre - no criticism has been made of the quality of service provided by the Town Council. The Town Council submitted a bid which would have ensured the centre raised more than enough money to keep replacing the artificial pitches as needed and further develop the centre. However, another bidder offered CBC more money than the Town Council, and so the Town Council's role will end on 31 March.

Dunstable Town Council is extremely proud to have developed the Creasey Park Community Football Centre since 2011 to the success it is now. The Town Council took the centre from bricks and mortar to a beacon of excellence for facility management and sports development. The Council's management has created an environment where clubs, teams, players, coaches and volunteers can flourish, develop and succeed both at semi-professional and grassroot levels.

Dunstable Town Council's mission was to ensure the 'community' aspect was always at the core of Creasey Park Community Football Centre. This has been achieved, not just through football, but via parent and toddler groups, long-standing weekly older people's lunch groups, free school holiday family fun days, pay and play sessions and community hires.

During the last 13 years Dunstable Town Council has invested £400,000 and worked closely with CBC to transform the facility with key additions such as a second Artificial Turf Pitch and full site irrigation system, along with stadium and building extensions. The centre has been recognised by The FA and Football Foundation as a model of best practice, and the centre garnered national acclaim, including National FA Groundsman awards, Quest accredited for 7 years, and has been Best Bar None accredited since 2015.

Creasey Park Community Football Centre will be under the new management of Bedfordshire FA (Beds FA) as of 1 April 2024. The Town Council will continue to deliver the older peoples' lunch club and Rock and Roll events at Creasey Park working with the Beds FA. Dunstable Town Council sincerely wishes the centre continued success, hoping it achieves the same level of accomplishment in the next 13 years as it has celebrated in the last.
