Supporting Community Growth in Dunstable



Dunstable has always thrived on the strength of its community spirit and that is why the Town Council is committed to ensuring that local groups, organisations and individuals have the support they need to continue making a difference. The Council has a range of funding opportunities and initiatives designed to help ideas grow, projects develop, and residents benefit.

Seedcorn Funding

These small grants are perfect for individuals with a fresh idea or for new and emerging groups hoping to get their first project off the ground. That's why the Council offers Seedcorn Grants of up to £500. The application process is straightforward, and this funding could be the very step that helps your idea flourish.

Service Level Agreements

For established community groups and organisations, the Council provides the opportunity to apply for a four-year Service Level Agreement. Grants typically range from £500 to £2,000 and can support either revenue or capital projects. To be successful, applications must demonstrate how the NEW project will benefit residents of Dunstable and align with the Council's Corporate Plan objectives. Funded projects are expected to deliver something new and meaningful for the community.







Do you run or are you member of a local sports club or society? Are you struggling to get funding for the basics like general running costs? We understand how difficult it can be to raise those vital funds, but as Matt Carrington, Chair of Dunstable Town Football Club shows, signing up to Dunstable Community Lottery could help make all the difference. Since singing up in May this year the club has raised £353.50 and is on track to raise £2,366 over the next 12 months.

When we spoke to Matt about his experience of the community lottery he said: "We're extremely pleased to be part of the Dunstable Community Lottery. As we don't own Creasey Park, a lot of money we raise has to go towards rental of pitches, but we truly want to be a fully inclusive club, so this will mean we are able to help support our youth coaches and give our young players the best experience possible."

"This money will go towards coaching courses for our youth coaches as well as equipment for our players. This will hopefully mean that every player that comes to Dunstable Town Football Club will be able to have an enhanced coaching experience as well as access to equipment to give them every chance to be as successful as possible."

It takes just 2 minutes to complete. Then, once your good cause is approved, you can start raising that vital cash. AN INTERVIEW WITH THE

Anglia in Bloom Judges

When the Anglia in Bloom judges visited Dunstable this year, the Town Council's Corporate Marketing and Communications Officer was given the chance to interview them for Talk of the Town. Here is what Chris, Paul and Adrian had to say:

What's your favourite part of being a judge?

Chris: Mine is the joy of meeting the community and all the different characters within that community. No matter where we go within East Anglia, all the people we meet have that common goal of wanting to make a difference for their community. It's just great to see.

Paul: I love seeing and hearing about new ideas and the way people all work differently to improve their environment. I then get to share these ideas with other communities that I visit, and this helps In Bloom grow from strength to strength.

Adrian: Meeting people, celebrating their achievements and acknowledging how hard they work for their community is very important. And seeing that sense of pride they have is fantastic.

Are there any new trends in horticulture or sustainability we should be adopting?

Chris: Sustainable, drought resistant and pollinator friendly planting is really important these days and we have seen some of that here in Dunstable including the work that Tony Parker and the Landscaping team are doing at the Woodside Industrial Estate. Caring about biodiversity and wildlife will be important for future generations.

Paul: Visiting Mentmore Recreation Ground you can see the transformation that is taking place to encourage wildlife and wildflowers. It looks very natural, and it is good to see that Dunstable is already ahead of the game.

Adrian: Encouraging people to respect wildlife, especially in their own gardens because gardens take up a large area of our country, and that is very important for wildlife.

If you were a flower, which one would you be and why?

Adrian: I would be a foxglove I think, because each individual flower on a foxglove is unique. There are no two flowers identical, and it's good to be unique.

Chris: Probably a lavender because no matter how you treat them, they seem to survive and be resilient and still come out smelling wonderful with a bit of fragrance and some colour as well.

Paul: I would be an Aquilegia (Colombine) because every plant that spreads seeds creates a new slightly differently plant.

What is the most unusual thing you've ever seen when judging?

Paul: Last year, I visited a community that bought an old car, cut the roof off and made it into a planter. A Mini in the centre of the village with plants growing out of it is a real talking point.




