Welcome to the summer bumper edition of Talk of the Town. As well as promoting all the great things the Town Council does in Dunstable, this edition also highlights the town centre and everything that is happening in and around the centre of town. Dunstable's town centre is often the subject of criticism but hopefully, the eight-page centre spread in this edition of Talk of the Town will help readers to appreciate what is actually happening in the town.

Dunstable is currently benefiting from millions of pounds worth of infrastructure investment. Not only has town centre traffic improved as a result of the new A5-M1 Link Road and the Luton Dunstable Guided Busway, but the town centre will also be benefiting soon from a new road layout on High Street North and South. The joint Central Bedfordshire Council/Dunstable Town Council Market Town Regeneration Fund initiative has resulted in improved town centre street cleansing; new entrance features to Priory Gardens; new architectural lighting on Grove House, Priory House and the Dunstable Conference Centre and of course the fantastic Bennett's Splash and Splashside Café. In addition, a number of town centre businesses have benefited from shop front makeovers because of the Central Bedfordshire Council High Street Improvement Scheme. Early next year the town will also benefit from a £20 million refurbishment to Dunstable Leisure Centre. The impact of all these investments has not only resulted in Dunstable becoming a more desirable place to live (and the associated increase in property values), but town centre retail vacancy rates are at a 10 year low and our centre page spread clearly illustrates that there are plenty of retail opportunities in the town.

This summer looks set to be another fun filled time for Dunstable residents with the launch of the Summer Activities Programme in August as well as the continuing events programme that includes the 'Motor Rally', 'Dunstable Live', 'Party in the Park', 'Priory Pictures' and 'Proms in the Park'.

Finally, keep a check on the Council's special markets taking place on the second and third Saturday of each month and please (if you haven't already) try out the excellent Splashside Café in Bennett Memorial Recreation Ground.

Outside of these hours or if your call goes to voicemail please leave a message and we will get back to you. The service is provided free apart from a small mileage charge for transport and any parking cost. All our volunteers are checked through the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) formerly known as the Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) and are covered by our insurance policy and carry photo ID badges.

We are not an emergency service, but we want to provide a friendly and helpful service so please try to give us a minimum of 24 hours notice.

If you feel you need help please call us and we will do our best to help you, if we cannot help we will try to point you to another appropriate group or service.

High Street Improvements

Central Bedfordshire Council has big plans for Dunstable's High Street. This article tells you a little more about what they plan to do, and how this investment will improve Dunstable town centre. Central Bedfordshire

Removing Railings

From mid to late August, we will start to remove railings and some other unnecessary street clutter from the High Street. Mark the entrances to the High Street / town centre with four new gateway features.

The gateways will provide an inviting entrance to the town centre; help to define the town centre; and indicate to drivers and pedestrians that they are entering a pedestrian-friendly, High Street environment. Three of these gateways will also incorporate drain features that will help take away rain water.

These gateway features will also include information about the history of Dunstable and have a map to show where places of interest are located (e.g. Priory Gardens and Grove House Gardens; Dunstable Town Council; Grove Skate Park; Dunstable Market; Priory Church; Grove Theatre; Quadrant Shopping Centre, etc.)

To reflect the local historical connections, we are suggesting these are named Friars Gate; Eleanor's Gate; Priory Gate; and St Mary's Gate. We will be working with the Dunstable and District Local History Society and local designers to create these gateways, as well as public art in other locations in the town where the history of Dunstable can be reflected.

Street Lighting

We will upgrade the street lighting along the High Street and along West Street and Church Street to match the existing lights on Court Drive.

Improve Middle Row

We will improve the Middle Row shopping area using new heritage-style paving to create its own identity separate from the High Street and to match the existing paving at the nearby Market Square for consistency. There will also be new cycle stands at either end; street benches to encourage people to remain in the area; and feature lighting to improve safety and make it more attractive in the evening.

Ashton Square

We will improve the Ashton Square area and make it more attractive by introducing a new gateway feature south of the square and at the entrances to Middle Row shopping area. We will also be removing the guard rails and extending the York stone paving to the edge of the road.

Queensway

We will improve the look of Queensway to make this feel like part of the new High Street, connecting the High Street and the Grove area by using the same paving materials and wider pavement areas. Queensway will be reduced down from three lanes to two lanes of traffic and made a 20mph zone. This will allow more space for pedestrians and reduce the width of the crossing along High Street North, helping to improve pedestrian access.

We will also install benches to make it more pedestrian-friendly.

Street Furniture

We will provide new benches, cycle racks, bins and tree planting along the High Street, Queensway and the Market Square to encourage visitors and shoppers, and make the area more attractive.

Long Term Improvements to Dunstable High Street

Subject to funding, we are also hoping to make the following longer term improvements.

Change the crossroads to be more pedestrian-friendly and enable a better flow of traffic throughout the town where the High Street, Church Street and West Street meet. The junction still needs to be controlled with traffic lights, but it will be made smaller and the pedestrian crossings will be moved closer to the junction and combined with the junction traffic lights. They will be changed from staggered crossings to straight-across 'Toucan' crossings (crossings where both pedestrians and cyclists cross the road) on all four sides of the cross roads. This means pedestrians won't need to walk as far to get across the junction, and traffic will no longer be held up by additional pedestrian crossings.

The sequencing of the traffic lights will be improved and can be changed by us if necessary to help traffic flow, for example if the M1 is closed.

Central Reservation and Wider Pavements

We will widen both of the footways on High Street North and create an attractive central reservation down the middle of the road with a 'boulevard' feel. This is an area that separates the opposite lanes of traffic on roads. It will create a more pleasant environment for pedestrians to spend time, create areas to sit, and make the traffic less dominant. By adding a central reservation, we will also improve informal crossings along the High Street.



Dunstable's oldest surviving inn is among five town centre shops and businesses that, from this week, will get facelifts as part of Central Bedfordshire Council's area-wide £1million High Street Improvement Scheme.

In partnership with the Town Council, this capital funding offered grants to landlords and businesses for up to 60 per cent of total costs of renovating shop fronts, forecourts and making improvements to vacant units, in order to attract more shoppers and visitors onto the high street.

The Saracen's Head, Lombardo's deli, Café Latte, Allframe – an art gallery and bespoke picture framer – and the vacant unit next door at 43 High Street North will collectively benefit from almost £50,000 from the Council to help transform their offers.

With parts of the building dating back to the 16th century, The Saracen's Head is steeped in history, though most of the old building was destroyed in a fire in

1815. But when it was being rebuilt, a buried hoard of coins was discovered, dating back to the years of the Civil War. In 1983, a 300-year-old cannonball was found in the garden, which is thought to date back to that time, when Oliver Cromwell's troops were in the area.

Cllr Nigel Young, Central Bedfordshire Council Executive Member for Regeneration, said: "We are committed to revitalising our market towns and The Saracen's Head encapsulates centuries of Dunstable's history and heritage. Added to that, Lombardo's has been an established family business which has offered Italian food and drink and been part of the social fabric of the town for 40 years, while Café Latte and Allframe, combined, have served the town for more than three decades, so we're delighted that these businesses will be able to enhance their offers and help boost the vibrancy of Dunstable.

"And, in giving a new lease of life to the vacant unit on High Street North, the High Street Improvement Scheme, in partnership with the Town Council, will help provide a home for another new business in the town." This will complement £1.25million of the Market Town Regeneration Fund initiatives already announced for Dunstable and co-funded with the Town Council – some completed, like the Bennett's Splash and the Splashside Café in Bennett Recreation Ground – and the £6.3million secured by Central Bedfordshire Council from the Government Housing Infrastructure Fund. All of which will help fulfil the authority's over-arching ambitions to give residents back their High Street and encourage people to spend more time in the centre of Dunstable.

Cllr Young added: "We have already begun re-routing heavy goods traffic away from the High Street, so the next step will first be the removal of railings and unnecessary street clutter to make it more pedestrian friendly. And with the transformation of some much-loved shops, pubs and businesses, courtesy of the High Street Improvement Scheme, there will be even more reason to visit Dunstable town centre."





Street Trading Consent

Central Bedfordshire Council is responsible for issuing street trading consents. You will need a street trader's consent if you want to trade in Dunstable or anywhere else in Central Bedfordshire.

The type of activity needing a consent are:

- Hot and cold food sellers (e.g. burger vans, ice cream vans)
- Sellers of non-food products from any vehicle, stall, barrow, trailer or any other moveable or static structure.

You will not need consent for:

- Fetes, carnivals or similar community-based and run events
- Non-commercial or charitable events
- Farmers' markets
- Sales of articles by householders on land contiguous with their homes



The business will allow anyone to use the toilet respectfully in their establishment without being a customer and therefore the need to purchase their commodity. A Community Toilet sticker is placed on the door of a participating business which gives the public the knowledge and right to use the toilet inside. Café Nostalgia (West Street)

and Kazmicks Café (Court Drive) will be Dunstable's first Community Toilets, with more businesses joining the scheme shortly. Café Nostalgia is open seven days a week from 7.00 am to 5.00 pm Mon to Sat, 8.00 am to 5.00 pm Sunday. Kazmicks Café is open from 9.00 am to 2.30 pm Monday to Friday, 9.00 am to 2.00 pm Saturday and closed on Sunday.

I hear you do some exciting hobbies, tell us more about the amateur dramatics group you are in?

My Hobbies are very much about me showing off, I love to dance which includes tap, contemporary and jazz and I have performed in many shows with Lytton players in Stevenage. At 6 months pregnant I was on stage at the Gordon Craig in Stevenage playing a cheerleader (shaking those pom poms). Over the last few years I have started to take on some small roles that are comedy based and I've even been made to sing. Made to sing is correct as it's not my favourite thing to do.

You previously worked at Hitchin Market, what do you find different in Dunstable?

My back ground was in care, independence training with people with learning disabilities. Working for Hitchin Market was a complete fluke with the experience I had in tenancies in housing lead to the market stall licence. I worked for Hitchin Market for 11 years before I came to Dunstable. It is actually very similar with the people you meet and the very public image you have while being outside. I knew Hitchin inside out with the amount of years I had been there. I have been welcomed into Dunstable and I am truly grateful for that. With the changes that are happening in Dunstable it is an exciting time to work here.

What is the most enjoyable part of your role?

The best part of my role is making new connections with the shops in the town and the positive help and service I can provide. I have also really enjoyed the pub watch/Best Bar None role that I have taken part in.

There are going to be some exciting changes in Dunstable town centre, how do you think these will benefit Dunstable?

There are exciting changes in Dunstable with whole areas being regenerated. This will hopefully make the town flow better and make it easier for people to walk to all the independent shops we have in town. New green areas within the town, benches, and lighting will make Dunstable feel and look brighter. People will start to notice the scaffolding around the shops and will be able to see the change happening.

There are some great shops in Dunstable, can you tell the readers why they should shop in their town centre?

Shopping in town is an experience, the local shops will know their customers which makes shopping a sociable past time within the town. I have met some very passionate retailers in town and we really need to protect and support our unique independent retailers. As we were not allowed to show our legs or bodies the beach was just for walking on. The compound I lived on had its own private beach so we did spend most of the winter on it. During the summer we had to stay in as it was too hot. (So just a reversal of the UK).

You have worked on a number of great projects in the town can you tell us more about them?

In my six months of working in Dunstable I have been involved in many projects. Acquiring a defibrillator for the town, which is based in Priory House. Engaging with the pubs and clubs with pub watch and Best Bar None. Looking at community toilets for the town. Helping the traders with street trading licences. I am about to take on the look of the notice boards in town and look at promoting the town and special markets.

And lastly... If you were a superhero for the day, what power would you have and why?

If I were a super hero for one day I would love to have the power of smile. I love to smile and I think it makes people smile back, I would love to give everyone I meet a smile. With their smile they can pass that on to all they meet.

BRA have raised various issues and residents' concerns with Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) officers, CBC and Dunstable Town Councillors, the MP Andrew Selous and the police who have all attended BRA meetings.

Local shopkeepers were supported when they were suffering from anti-social behaviour and residents were supported when the old Delco site was demolished and rats became a problem.

In 2009 to 2011, BRA and the late Cllr. Julian Murray, worked tirelessly to protect the area around the archaeological site of the Maiden Bower Fort from development. This site has now been given the status of "The most important Scheduled Monument in Central Bedfordshire".

BRA are still supporting residents with issues great and small, such as blocked drains, fly-tipping and over-grown trees. This small group, of likeminded local residents, want to ensure that all residents have a say in issues that affect their community.
